Music Notes

We are so fortunate to have received a loan of nine Orff xylophones from a retired teacher. Thank you, Starla Warburton! We nearly have one xylophone per student in classes now!

In Lower El classes, we are transferring our knowledge of the solfege system to the barred instruments, improvising a melody using a known text ("Apple Tree" - Group A last week and Group B this week), exploring the quality of sounds with different types of mallets on different sizes of instruments (soprano, alto, & bass) and metal vs wood bars. The students are working on perfecting mallet technique by using alternating hands and bouncing the mallets to allow the bars to ring or vibrate ... with a physics lesson thrown in on sound waves. Of course, we always have a large movement piece or dance to get the beat in the body in every class. The students proved their readiness for the instrument ensemble by making up new rhythms over a 4-beat phrase using the phrase "Happy New Year" and reordering and/or repeating the words in different combinations.

Upper El students are concentrating on preparing ensemble pieces to perform at the EPMS Talent Show and for a visit to a retirement community in February. Some students are missing folders and recorders which affects the progress of the whole class. I will be sending letters home for students who are missing these items next week in order to determine if I need to replace them.

A posted list of how many songs EPMS students have learned this year is on my to-do list. There are no music classes next week, due to the holiday schedule.
