

LCFF funds include a base level of funding for all LEAs and extra funding - called "supplemental and concentration" grants - to LEAs based on the enrollment of high needs students (foster youth, English learners, and low-income students).




This chart shows the total general purpose revenue Eagle Peak Montessori School expects to receive in the coming year from all sources.

The total revenue projected for Eagle Peak Montessori School is \$3,093,620, of which \$2,720,687 is Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF), \$204,855 is other state funds, \$168,078 is local funds, and \$0 is federal funds. Of the \$2,720,687 in LCFF Funds, \$56,690 is generated based on the enrollment of high needs students (foster youth, English learner, and low-income students).

This chart provides a quick summary of how much Eagle Peak Montessori School plans to spend for 2021-22. It shows how much of the total is tied to planned actions and services in the LCAP.

Eagle Peak Montessori School plans to spend \$3,137,241 for the 2021-22 school year. Of that amount, \$60,600 is tied to actions/services in the LCAP and \$3,076,641 is not included in the LCAP. The budgeted expenditures that are not included in the LCAP will be used for the following:



Increased or Improved Services for High Needs Students in the LCAP for the 2021-22 School Year

In 2021-22, Eagle Peak Montessori School is projecting it will receive \$56,690 based on the enrollment of foster youth, English learner, and low-income students. Eagle Peak Montessori School must describe how it intends to increase or improve services for high needs students in the LCAP. Eagle Peak Montessori School plans to spend \$60,600 towards meeting this requirement, as described in the LCAP.
